
In brief:

- Three Elected Members and the CEO attended Cue Parliament on Friday 6 May 2011.
- One Elected Member and the CEO attended a 'Planning for Change' Forum in Perth on Thursday 12 May 2011.
- It is probable that FESA will be supplying the Shire with two firefighting units for the Bush Fire Brigade—a final decision on this is yet to made.
- Planning for the Shire of Murchison Astrofest is well under way and the event will take place on Saturday 20 August 2011. It is hoped to attract at least 150 people to participate in this inaugural event.



Murchison's Roads

- The Shire has received approval for approximately \$2,5 million funding to repair the February flood damage following approval for \$4.75 million funding for the December flood. These funds will ensure continued reconstruction of damaged areas throughout the Shire.
- A further 10kms of Carnarvon Mullewa Road has now been sealed taking the sealed section from Murchison Settlement to the Twin Peaks turnoff.
- New grids are under construction to replace broken ones around the Shire.
- General works being undertaken include—replacing depth marker signs at creek crossing; erecting/replacing signs and guideposts throughout the Shire; repair of low level crossing at Ballinyoo Bridge.
- Paul Smart, Council's maintenance grader driver is taking some time off for medical reasons and Mick Wall who has previously worked for the Shire will be undertaking Paul's duties pending his return. Paul is wished a speedy recovery and we look forward to him being able to resume his role here.
- Ross Collins is working with Stuart Broad in the general works around the Shire.









Message from the CEO

As you are all aware the Shire of Murchison is a very large area with a vast network of roads, most of which are unsealed. In order that I can make a more informed decision regarding road closures during inclement weather I need to rely on information from the whole community regarding rainfall in each area and the effect that rain is having on the roads around you. This is particularly important at times such as long weekends when most staff are away from the Settlement and are unable to carry out any physical assessment on behalf of Council.

As CEO the ultimate decision regarding road closures is mine and it is an onerous task to try to assess correctly the condition of every road without benefit of inspection. There is frequently contention about whether a particular road should be closed to traffic or not and your ongoing assistance would be invaluable in allowing the most appropriate decision to be made to ensure that the roads are maintained to a good standard and the travelling public are safe.


So there you go, nothing really extraordinary, but I thought you should know that we are just the everyday person and are very happy to be part of your Murchison community.


It was Sid's 77th birthday last month and he celebrated in fine form. He treated members of the Settlement to a little gettogether, laying on the food and beverages in fine style.

Spaghetti With Smoked Salmon

I tablespoon oil

2 sun-dried tomatoes, cut into pieces
100g smoked salmon,
sliced or chopped
100g feta cheese, cubed
I large tomato, chopped
½ bunch chives, snipped
250g spaghetti


